Puppets, live music and free refreshments with a good sprinkling of the Gospel. That was the recipe for the outdoor 2022 Summer Mission run by Ebenezer Baptist Church, Abertillery.

Inclement weather meant the first of the three Thursday evening events had to be switched to the church hall but the Kids Puppet Show attracted about 100 people including mums and children. The second event held in the town's Jubilee Square drew 200 people who enjoyed a night of live music. The final event – again in the Jubilee Square – featured Rockin Revelation whose singer is Paul James, son of the Revd. John James, former minister at Tabernacle, Penarth, who ensured there was a strong focus on evangelism and the call to salvation.

The Revd. Jason Wilkins, Ebenezer minister, said: "Our Summer Mission comprised 'bridging events' aimed at giving the church a stronger presence in the community and an opportunity to build relationships with people who would otherwise never come into a church building. We are encouraged because now some new people are attending other church events."

Abersychan near Pontypool is 5,332 miles from Los Angeles, California but that is the gulf the Revd. Jeff Kim and his wife, Linda, have crossed to serve the Lord in Wales.

Apart from the physical distance, the South Korean/American couple also have made a long journey of faith seeking the Lord's will in terms of future ministry and mission since 2014. That chapter finally came to an end in July when Jeff accepted a unanimous call to be pastor at High Street Baptist Church, Abersychan.

Jeff officially began his ministry at the church on Sunday, 4th September. The date of his induction service will be Saturday 3rd December. The High Street fellowship, established in 1824 with its church building being erected three years later, has been faithfully led by church secretary Mrs Barbara Tucker over many years. Now it can look forward to a bright future after, at one time, facing the threat of possible closure.

"We believe God has pointed us to the right church, in the right place at the right time after much prayer and soul-searching" Jeff said. "We know God has a plan for this church even in these challenging days and that He will do amazing things for His glory.

"The foundation of the ministry will be based upon prayer and solid Bible preaching and teaching. We want to introduce new people in the community to Jesus and His saving power."

Jeff and Linda have participated in various ministries for more than 20 years and travelled to more than 40 countries on mission work.

The couple, who had lived in Los Angeles since 1988, are commissioned by the First Presbyterian Church of Orange County, southern California with whom they maintain strong links. They thank God for the tremendous joint support they have received from the Baptist Union of Wales (BUW), the Gwent Baptist Association and its member churches.

Jeff and Linda first came to the UK in 2014 serving for a spell at West Drayton Baptist Church near London Heathrow Airport. God subsequently placed on their hearts the need of mission work in Wales – a conviction that became even stronger following contact with the Revd. Peter Cho, pastor at Tabernacle Baptist Church, Newbridge.

Two visits to Wales in 2015 and 2019, when they met the Revd Simeon Baker and the Revd. Marc Owen (both of the BUW), resulted in God confirming in their hearts that He wanted them to serve in Wales.



After arriving in Gwent at the end of July last year, the couple spent a six-month "induction" period under the guidance of Peter Cho – first at Tabernacle and then wider afield – learning about Welsh culture and church life in the South Wales valleys. The couple are also grateful to the Revd. Richard Harrison, former deacon at Upper Trosnant Baptist Church, Pontypool for his godly advice and help.

Jeff received a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Sociology from the University of California Los Angeles, a Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Multicultural Education from National University, a Master of Divinity (M.Div.) from Talbot School of Theology and a second Master of Divinity (M.Div.) from the International Reform University and Seminary.

He enjoys drinking good coffee and among his interests are running and playing the guitar in praise and worship as well as expository preaching and teaching and seeking to hear God's voice through the leading of the Holy Spirit.

TIME TO ENGAGE TOGETHER



Church ministers and leaders in Gwent and throughout Wales have taken part in a two-year journey of missional training with Cameron Roxburgh (Forge Canada).

Some churches from the Baptist Union of Wales and beyond and individuals have been doing the more intensive fortnightly programme called Ethos via Zoom whilst others have been following the monthly Explore track sharing in conversation and discussion.

One key feature has been the desire to see the church here in Wales grow in its confidence to join God in mission. Now the plan is to continue the missional journey through Engage. As the name suggests, Engage is all about taking appropriate steps to see if what has been learned together can help the church to reach out beyond the church walls into our local communities with the love of God. The Engage "theory into practice" online meetings will be held on the second Thursday of the month.

The Rev Simeon Baker, BUW Director of Mission, said: "I know that leading any church these days is challenging, especially when it is engaging in mission in ways that look different to how we've always done it. But if the church is to move beyond the 'Sunday service' model in a post-Christian Wales we are convinced we need to do this together, if we are to do it at all."

Please pray for this exciting ongoing initiative and that new people, young and old, will come to know Jesus as their Lord and Saviour.

GRANTS FOR MISSION WORK

Is your church active in community outreach and mission? Then why not apply to the Gwent Baptist Association for a special Association grant.

Funds are available to support initiatives which are clearly based on mission - initiatives to go out into the world and spread the Gospel message. Grants are normally made for up to £1,000 in any one year.

Past experience has shown that people interpret "mission" in different ways so to help potential applicants the Association has an easy-to-understand Mission Grants Form. This form must be used to make the applications and it highlights the supporting information required before such grants can be approved.

The Association must have signed confirmation that the request for grant support has been agreed by a church members' meeting and the completed application form must be accompanied by the latest audited church accounts.

Grant applications can be considered at any time of the year.


